## HLF Project Update



**LOTTERY FUNDED**

It's 2017 and the team are pulling together the finishing design touches for each project element to secure contractors and begin work on site. Significant time has been spent refining the lake design following further surveys and investigation. These surveys have unearthed new results that have dictated a change in the proposals.

The previous drawings reflected the plan for a by-pass channel, which sought to act as a sustainable solution carrying silt away from the lake.

However, in recent months it has become clear that this solution is no longer viable. Recent tests have highlighted levels of permeability in the lake bed that could lead to water draining from the main lake into the channel. The costs to remove this risk are too high and cannot provide the required certainty.

As such, two options without the new channel are being considered. Option 1 dredges the lake and sees the construction of a silt trap to try and contain silt deposits in one place. Option 2 is a straight dredge only, with an understanding that this will be required again in another 40-50 years. Whilst this is not ideal, the associated costs with cleaning a silt trap at least once a year are significant, with little revenue certainty to commit to this. Roads required to export the silt could also be detrimental to the landscape.

Both options are still being evaluated but the Steering Group, the Council, HLF and the Design Team believe a straight dredge is the best solution to achieve the main aim of cleaning the lake.

Whatever the solution the silt will still be used to create one large island with a great habitat created for the ducks and birds.

This month further tree removals are taking place in and around the stock pond. Once a fantastic feature of the park the pond is now heavily silted and obscured by a range of self-sown plants. Removing some of these will help open up the space once more, and prevent significant leaf litter that would contribute to silt build up.
