## HLF Project Update



### What's new in the HLF project?

The start of the main works in Beddington Park is getting close! The works have now been put out for tender, to procure the contactor(s) to deliver the plans that have been developed and refined over the last few years.

Following the necessary changes to the lake design the final decision is to carry out a straightforward dredge to clean the lake. As was always proposed this silt will then be used across a number of areas on site, including to reform the islands and plant them with great new habitat to support the wildfowl.

The contractors will be selected in May and a schedule of works should be finalised by June. Information on which areas of the park will be closed to public access, and when, will be made available as soon as the schedule of works has been finalised. The main period of works should begin in July and run until early 2018. The work to the lake will begin in August, after the nesting season, whilst the playground works will commence after the summer holidays.



## LOTTERY FUNDED

The team are working to compress the timings of the delivery of the works to limit disruption to as short a period as possible. A project like this cannot be delivered without significant disruption. Please be patient with the look of the park during this period and look forward to the finished result!

This is a project that has been developed and shaped by park users and stakeholders, and the stakeholder steering group continue to monitor and contribute towards the process of delivery.

**Tree Wardens**

Our Tree Warden Scheme is a great opportunity for anyone 16+ to help maintain, increase and care for the many trees in our park. The scheme involves training sessions (internal and external), group activities, and materials and support for independent work. How much you get involved is up to you!



**Beddington Park Buddies**

We are now recruiting for volunteers for our new Buddy scheme. Set to start next month the buddies will offer support to local care homes to give their residents access to our wonderful park. Support care home staff by offering a supportive arm or pushing a wheelchair to allow our elderly community the chance to enjoy a walk in the park. An induction and basic training is provided, but no formal skills are required. Just a patient and caring attitude! Volunteers need to be available on weekdays.

**Observation Surveys**

Volunteers are needed to help us observe who is using the park and how. Each year we have to submit data to the Heritage Lottery Fund - our funding body - to show how use of the park is changing. If you enjoy walking round the park then you could help us by completing a survey as you go! This survey is by observation only and training is provided. A great way to support the project whilst enjoying the park!
