Honeywood Museum, Carshalton

The Drawing Room

Whitehall Historic House, Cheam



The Tudor Hall

Whitehall Historic House is a unique building, a rare piece of domestic architecture built before Henry VIII came to the throne.

Constructed in 1500, Whitehall is Grade II* listed, and one of very few timber framed buildings left in the Greater London area that is more than 500 years old. Set in the heart of Cheam Village, it has been associated with royalty, housed ambitious schemes for education, and been a home to many notable families crucial to the area's evolution.

Ceremonies take place within the Tudor Hall - an original part of the medieval structure, providing room for 24 seated guests, plus the couple to be. Tie the knot in front of an impressive fireplace, under ancient wooden beams. The building's quirky jetty-set porch offers excellent photo opportunities, and the beautifully maintained gardens provide a relaxed and tranquil atmosphere.

The Freedom Caffe provides after ceremony drinks and menu options.

Whitehall has been recently restored and refurbished with help from the National Heritage Lottery Fund. New exhibitions throughout the museum tell stories of people from the area and the residents of Whitehall.
