Exhibition - Women in the Frame Female Portraits from the Knights-Whittome Collection 1904-18 Extended Showing until 2 June

Between 1904 and 1918, a small high street photographer's studio in Sutton quietly documented the lives of ordinary local women during an extraordinary period of history. With funding from the Heritage Lottery, Sutton Archives has brought these women back to the forefront of the Borough's history and celebrated their lives in this exhibition which marks the centenary of the 1918 Parliamentary Act that enabled women to vote in national elections for the first time.

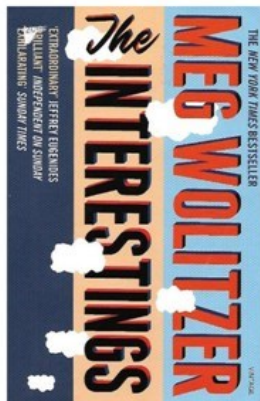

BOOK CLUB

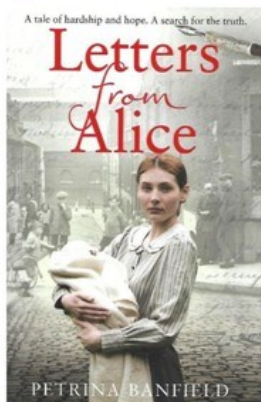
The Honeywood Book Club is run by The Friends and usually meets once a month on a Sunday afternoon between 14:30 and 16:30

An illustrated talk by Ian Bevan

City of London Guide Ian Bevan starts his talk with the First World War and its effect on Londoners. After the Armistice, London was the scene for protests of various sorts including the General Strike in 1926. However, in the inter-war years, new transport developments encouraged the growth of the suburbs with new and exciting architecture. Also, new buildings were erected in the modernist style for industry and entertainment e.g. cinemas. London too hosted spectacular events like the British Empire Exhibition as well as FA Cup Finals, Test matches and success at Wimbledon. Rising tensions though eventually led to the outbreak of another world war.
