

Privacy Policy

We at The Friends of Honeywood Museum (FoHM) take your individual privacy seriously. We aim to ensure that this site meets and exceeds all relevant legal and regulatory requirements, including the Data Protection Act.

Any personal information collected via the web site will be stored and processed exclusively for the purposes of FoHM.

No personal information you provide via this web site will be passed on to any third party. Your details will not be kept for longer than necessary. FoHM are the sole owner of any information we collect via the web site.

Contacting you

If you provide your personal details for some purpose - for example to send us comments or a query - we will use the information provided to contact you only in relation to the specifics of your request. At the same time you may be offered the opportunity to sign up to regular news and information bulletins.

Web site statistics

We use traffic analysis tools to analyse traffic on this web site. These tools display only aggregate data such as the total number of visitors and "hits" each day; we do not track the movement of individual users.

Cookies

This site may place a "cookie" on your personal computer. Cookies are short text files which are transferred between your computer and our server whenever you request a page on our web site. We use a cookie for the collection of anonymous, aggregate visitor traffic statistics and to identify you if you log in to the site. It also aids navigation and save any language preference you may have. This cookie is deleted when you close your browser.

These cookies may not be deleted when you close your browser, but may be stored on your computer for up to 90 days and 14 days respectively. We do not save any personal information in any cookie. We do not access any information stored in cookies placed on your computer by other web sites. **We do not share any information with 3rd parties, so there is no threat to your privacy.**

(We may also use a cookie to remember whether you have voted in an opinion poll and will use a cookie if you choose to remember your login on your current computer, if circumstances should arrive in the future when we require such things - we currently do not.).
